Grading, Report Cards, & Homework

- Grades will appear in each courses' gradebook in Canvas
- Assignments will be graded in points
- Quarter grades will be determined by percentage of points earned
- A grade on the report card will be given for Reading, Writing, Mechanics, Spelling, Math Concepts, Math Problem Solving, Science, Social Studies, and Health
