Dear Parents,

Thank you to the many parents who were able to find time in their busy schedules to attend the many evening information sessions that Phelps Luck has hosted during the past two weeks. Back to School Nights, Spanish Information Night, Back to Bridges Night, and the first PTA meeting of the year all enjoyed great turnouts. Please continue to keep an eye on future opportunities to participate in various parent workshops and information sessions throughout the year. Additionally, the PTA hosts meetings the first Wednesday of every month from 7-8pm. There is always an open invitation for parents to attend these meetings.

Today, progress reports have been distributed to go home. These progress reports provide a general overview of your child's progress thus far in not only academic areas, but also learning behaviors. Please take time to review the progress reports together with your child. It s a great opportunity to celebrate strengths and collaboratively create goals aimed at addressing areas needed for improvement. When such discussions occur, feelings of ownership, accountability, and support are often increased.

Please be aware that Phelps Luck, in coordination with all schools in the Howard County School System, has implemented a new "Visitor Sign In" process in the front office. The system is called Lobby Guard and it involves an electronic procedure to sign in the school as a guest. Previously, schools utilized a pencil and paper sign in process. However, with an increased emphasis on school security, Lobby Guard provides a printed label with your picture and name that must be worn as you walk throughout our building to visit classrooms, attend meetings, or join your child for lunch. Additionally, prior to receiving the printed label and after scanning your driver's license or entering your information, Lobby Guard cross-references visitor information to the Sex Offender Registry. With no match, a label is printed. If a match is identified, the front office staff has been trained to navigate potential issues.

Although the sign-in process may take a couple of extra seconds, the additional security it provides our children is certainly beneficial.
