From the Principal. . .

Dear Parents,

It has been such a great experience welcoming back all of our new and returning families to Phelps Luck for what promises to be an exciting school year. It has been so motivating to interact with our students in the hallways, café, playground, or classrooms – there is such a positive feeling that continues to exist throughout the building. Throughout the first eight days of school, I have observed our students in grades 1-5 not only quickly becoming acclimated with classmates, but also enthusiastically embracing the new components of their school day, specifically Spanish instruction and navigating AM/PM classrooms associated with departmentalization. Essentially, your child attends two different classes throughout the day - one focusing on ELA/Social Studies and one focusing on Math/Science.

Daily Spanish instruction and departmentalization are two of the components associated with our Elementary School Model. Other components include full-day pre-K for eligible families, partnership with Gallup to promote Strengths Based awareness and instruction, and the adoption of the TeleHealth program.

I would like to take another opportunity at our Back to School Nights, during the Administrative Report (6:00-6:30), to review these components in detail and answer/clarify any questions you may have developed after your child started the school year.
