From the Principal. . .

Dear Parents.

Although the Orioles run in the postseason ended rather abruptly, this year's team helped make baseball relevant again in our area. It was exciting to witness, and be a participant in the renewed enthusiasm and pride generated by our state in our local team. However, I am going to avoid watching Sports Center the next few days as it makes me feel slightly bitter listening to the anchors gush over Kansas City[©] Congratulations to all the Nationals and Orioles fans in our community – both teams made it fun in October!

As I am sure your child has shared with you, our students in grades 1-5 have recently completed initial MAP testing. MAP (Measure of Academic Performance) is designed to measure student growth within an academic year and eventually across multiple school years. Students will participate in MAP testing once again later in the year. The assessment was taken in its entirety on the computer. Students in all grade levels were provided an opportunity to take a practice sample test first so that they could become accustomed to the look and feel of participating in an online assessment.

MAP assessments are aligned to the national Common Core Standards for Mathematics and Reading and are measured using selected response (multiple choice) questions. There are no performance based or constructed response items (written responses). No two children took the exact same test as MAP questions continually adapt to each individual child and the responses they provided to each question.

Data ascertained from MAP will help teachers and me determine instructional strengths and areas of need. Additionally, MAP will generate a norm-referenced report that compares how individual students performed with HCPSS and national peers. Phelps Luck will distribute MAP Student Reports with the $1^{\rm st}$ quarter report cards.
