From the Principal. . .

Happy Thursday! The weather extremes that our area has experienced this year certainly continued yesterday. Seven inches of rain reportedly felt yesterday alone in Laurel. I delayed dismissal yesterday by a couple of minutes to allow a strong rain shower to pass before asking students to venture out to their cars or busses. I also gathered all our student walkers in the media center and talked to them about the dangers of getting too close to rising streams along the pathways home. After our talk, I released our walkers a few minutes late as well. I was proud of the entire student body and staff members for their actions in ensuring a smooth and safe dismissal for all.

Recently, there have been increased incidences of students engaging in unsafe behaviors on the bus rides home from school. Some recent behaviors that have been observed or reported include students getting out of their seats, standing on their seat, and students turning around on their knees to interact with students seated behind them. As you can imagine, a bus driver's job is a demanding one - one that requires the driver to be responsible for the safety and well being of 30-50 children. When students engage in unsafe actions such as the ones described above, regardless of how innocent those actions may be, it makes the driver's job that much more challenging.

While I have ridden many busses home to reinforce my expectations and have engaged in productive conversations with specific students, and their families, about individualized issues, I want to take this opportunity to reach out to our community in hopes that it can inspire the same discussions at home. If your child rides a bus, please take a moment to outline your expectations about staying in their seats. In addition to the safety issue, I also explain to students that their actions on the bus help define our reputation as a school throughout the community. Thank you!

Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten Registration

Kindergarten, Pre-Kindergarten, and new student registration has begun. Come in between 9:30 am and 2:00 pm to register for the 2014 – 2015 school year. Kindergarten is mandatory in Maryland, and state law requires that children entering kindergarten in the fall of 2014 must be 5 years of age before September 1, 2014. Children entering Pre-Kindergarten in the fall of 2014 must be 4 years old on or before September 1, 2014. Children entering first grade in the fall of 2014 must be 6 years old before September 1, 2014. Parents or legal guardians are to register students at the school currently serving the address where the child's parent or guardian resides. The parent or guardian must present the following information at the time of registration:

- The child's birth certificate
- An authorized record of immunizations
- Proof of residency in the form of a lease, a deed, or house contract, and a utility bill
- Photo ID of the parent/guardian
- Proof of custody (if applicable)

Driver's licenses and voter registration cards will not be accepted as proof of residence. State law prohibits a child from attending school for even one day unless proof of immunization has been provided. Immunization and health forms are available at every school.

Students who are currently enrolled in any HCPSS pre-kindergarten program are not required to re-register for kindergarten.

IMPORTANT REMINDER

If you have moved or plan on moving, please notify the office of your new address. You will need to bring your new lease/deed and a current utility bill to the office in order for your child's record to be changed.
