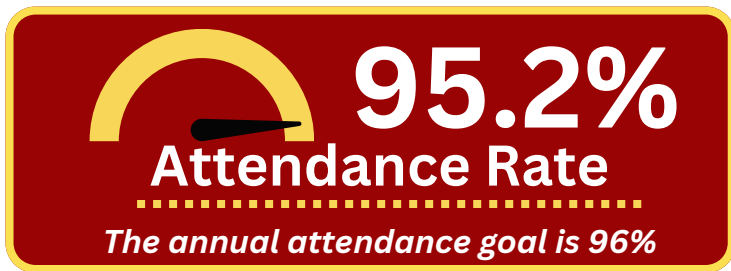

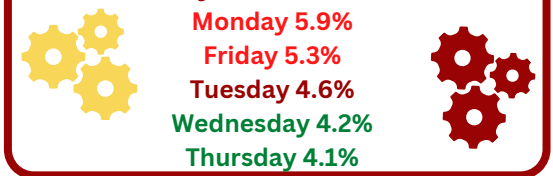
### Chronic Absentee Rate

### Year to Date Reasons for Absences

The most frequent reason for absence is **illness** accounting for **1,659** days absent.

2,553.5 absences were recorded as **unexcused** because no note followed the absence.

### When Do Absences Become a Problem?

**CHRONIC ABSENCE** 18 or more days  
**WARNING SIGNS** 10 to 17 days  
**SATISFACTORY** 9 or fewer absences

Office Disciplinary Referrals (ODRs) were given to students when an administrator deemed the incident report a violation of the student code of conduct or was a repetitive incident.

Frequent reasons for ODRs: Physical aggression/attack

**Reflection**  
Did your child receive an IR or ODR? Did they learn from the situation?

By reinforcing positive behaviors, teachers spend more time teaching, as class disruptions, office referrals, and suspensions are reduced.
