

 If you need to make a change on how your child is going home, PLEASE call the front office no later than 2:30 to ensure your child gets home safely.






 ALL walkers will be picked up at the rear kindergarten door, regardless of where they enter in the morning. A staff member will be at the door to release your child safely to you.

- Sharing student progress at Parent Teacher Conferences in November and in February!




